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- The title should be clear and brief, and should not exceed 20 words.
- The affiliation address for each author should be indicated by superscript Arabic numbers (1, 2, 3, etc.). Please keep your affiliations as succinct as possible (for example, do not differentiate among departments of the same organization). This template was designed for two affiliations.

Abstract (TNR, font 11)

Articles must include an abstract of 200 words or fewer.

The abstract usually contains of brief explanation of the purpose, the method, and the result of the research. The abstract should not repeat the information already present in the title.

Keywords: *component; formatting; style; styling; insert*

- Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of 5 keywords written in alphabetical order. Please avoid general terms, multiple concepts (avoid, for example, and or of), and abbreviations. Only abbreviations firmly established in the field are eligible.

1. Introduction (TNR, font 11)

This template, modified in MS Word 365 and saved as a “Word 97-2003 Document” for the PC, provides authors with most of the formatting specifications needed for preparing electronic versions of their papers. Margins, column widths, line spacing, and type styles are built-in; examples of the type styles are provided throughout this document and are identified in italic type, within parentheses, following the example. Some components, such as multi-leveled equations, graphics, and tables are not prescribed, although the various table text styles are provided. The formatter will need to create these components, incorporating the applicable criteria that follow.

The manuscript including the graphic contents, tables, and references should be maximum 5000 words in length. If it far exceeds the prescribed

length, it is recommended to break it into two separate manuscripts.

The template is used to format your paper and style the text. All margins, column widths, line spaces, and text fonts are prescribed; please do not alter them. You may note peculiarities. For example, the head margin in this template measures proportionately more than is customary. This measurement and others are deliberate, using specifications that anticipate your paper as one part of the entire proceedings, and not as an independent document. Please do not revise any of the current designations.

The first letter of headings and subheadings are capitalized and headings are numbered in Arabic numerals. The organization of the manuscript includes **Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion and Conclusions, and References. Acknowledgement** (if any) is written after

Conclusion and before **References** and not numbered. The use of subheadings is discouraged.

Introduction section usually consists of the importance of the research, literature review on the topic or variables, and the hypothesis.

2. Methods

Sample. This section usually consists of the description of research participants, including the number, characteristics, sampling method, and recruitment process, if necessary.

Research Design. Briefly explain the design of the research.

Instrument and Measurement. State and explain every instrument or measurement used in the research. It is necessary to explain the validity and reliability of each psychological measurement scales or tests used.

Procedure. Explain of the procedure used in the research. Be as transparent as possible.

3. Results

This section contains the result of the research, the testing of research hypothesis. Tables, graphics, or figures may be used if necessary. Statistical symbols should be written accordingly. Refer to APA publication manual.

Tables are written with Times New Roman font size 10. The title of the table is written above the table as prescribed in the format given below as example. The table is numbered in Arabic numerals. The table is placed immediately after it is referred to in the text. The frame of the table uses 1 font-size line. If the title in each table column is long and complex, the columns are numbered and the notes are given below the table.

Graphic contents are placed symmetrically on the page and there is one blank single space line between the graphic content and the paragraphs. A graphic content is placed immediately after it is referred to in the body of the text and is numbered in

Arabic numerals. The caption is written in font size 10, boldface, and placed as in the example.

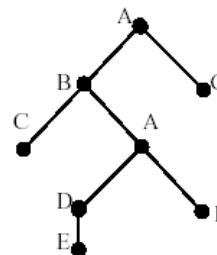


Figure 1. Example of a figure caption.

For any graphic contents which have been published by another author, the corresponding author must obtain a written permission from that other author and his/her publisher. Include one graphic content which is printed in good quality in a full-size page or scanned graphic content in good resolution in the format as follows {name of file}.jpeg, or {name of file}.tiff. If the graphic content is in the form of photograph, include one original photograph. The photograph is printed in black and white unless the photograph will appear in color. The author will be charged an additional fee for color printing.

Citation in the paper can be in direct or indirect quotation. Footnotes should be avoided. Refer to APA publication manual in writing every citation (for example, each citation is accompanied with the writer’s family/last name; write the page number for direct citation, etc.).

4. Discussion & Conclusion

Discussion. This section usually contains of the explanation of the research result or the discovery made in the research. Collect and summarize the most important results and their implications. The status of the problem should be briefly reviewed before the new findings are presented. This section also contains of the explanation of the result compared to previous researches, the limitation of the study, and the potential areas of further research.

Conclusions. Summarize your research, in relation to the hypothesis presented in early section of the writing.
